Department of social work in MES College Erumely has participated in the organization of District Level Mass Awareness Programme related to Child Rights Week Observations 2017 which was organised by the District Child Protection Unit, Kottayam in association with Kerala State Commission for Protection of Child Rights. It was held on 14th to 20th November 2017 in Kottayam district with the certification of Integrated Child Protection Scheme under the Social Justice Department, Government Of Kerala. As social work professionals and trainees it was a great opportunity to participate in the programme and developed an empathetic approach to work with the children. This Programme includes the awareness regarding the rights of the children, challenges and problems of the children, laws to protect children, activities of childline and interventions for the betterment of the children. The programme created an idea about the reason for considering the children as a weaker section. The department effectively used art as a medium of communication to the public to enhance the awareness of child rights. The student social workers from the department performed flash mobs across the district with various themes related to child protection. It was aimed at creating a safe space for children in the world to fight against the socio-cultural, economic and political vulnerabilities of children.

**Awareness class on Blue Whale

The Student Social Workers of MES College, Erumely conducted an awareness class on Blue Whale Game at Mahima Kudumbasree at Mukkoottuthara on 12th September 2017.

Mahima Kudumbasree was established on 2nd April 2000. It consists of 18 members. This group is organised for the empowerment of women in Mukkoottuthara locality and developing their skills and financial support. The members are engaged in various activities such as organic farming, home made products, rice business etc. They are actively participating in charity programmes and paliative care.

The meeting started at 2PM with prayer. Mrs Sally Joseph, President Mahima Kudumbasree delivered the welcome speech. Student social worker, MES College Erumely delivered the main speech on BLUE WHALE GAME. The blue whales is neither fish nor foul but a 'killer' online game of inflating proportions that nobody has reliably encountered. It is a sequence of online 'cares that participants must progressively engage into get ahead. These include etching a blue whale on your skin and jumbing of buildings. There have been atleast 3 reported suicides in India of youths who, according to media reports, where playing or had searched for the game online. Importantly police officials have so far claimed that there is no evidence that these youths took their lives following instructions from the game. There is also no report of authorities actually encountering this game online in India.

This, however, hasn't stopped members of parliament from demanding that Facebook and Microsoft work to remove all online links to the game. The origins of this game and reportage surrounding it have been in Central Asian countries, including Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Russia. This psychopathic game started in Russia 4 years ago on a social networking sites called VKontakte. It has already claimed over 130 lives in Russia. It allegedly led to its first suiciding in 2015. Philipp Budeikin, a psychology student claimed that he invented the game. Budeikin, who was thrown out of his university, said he was attempting to weed out the society by encouraging those who have no value to take their lives. Other reports claim that the master mind behind the game, a postman called Ilya Sidorov, 26 was arrested in Moscow, Russia. He used to encourage teenagers to hurt themselves and eventually commit suicide. What is worrying is that despite the common knowledge that the deadly game started and spread on VKontakte, which is a hugely popular site in Russia, no checks were brought in place to conatin the network. One can easily create a VKontakte account. And once you login, and search for #bluewhale, you come across psychotic extremely depressing messages of young people desperately wanting to play the game and end their lives. Their profiles are as macabre as it can get. There are pictures of self injury, ghosts and horrifying sketches of people bleeding and crying to get themselves. So always ask your children how things are going. Ask if there have been things stressing them, or anything that has them worried. If your child is talking about any level of distress, do not hesitate to ask them about changes in mental health. Unless there is reason to believe your child already knows of or has played the game, don't discuss the blue whale game. By doing so, you increase the chance that your child will search for it on their own. Monitor your children's online and social media activity to ensure they are not engaging with this game. Keep your eyes open for unusually secretive behavior, mostly related to their online activity. Parents should take reports from child counsellor present in the school at regular intervals. If you fear your child may be at risk, get professional help right away. Remind your child that you are their and support them as they face life challenges. AWARENESS CLASS



Department of Social Work, MES college, Erumely conducted a community activity in association with Manimala Grama Panchayat based on organic farming. Social work students from MSW department organized the activity. By looking forward to the importance and benefits of the organic farming students took an initiative to organize a class session it is known that , organic farming is a production system which avoids or largely excludes the use of synthetically compounded fertilizers, pesticides, growth regulators, genetically modified organisms and livestock food additives. To the maximum extent possible organic farming system rely upon crop rotations, use of crop residues, animal manures, legumes, green manures, off farm organic wastes, biofertilizers, mechanical cultivation, mineral bearing rocks and aspects of biological control to maintain soil productivity and tilth to supply plant nutrients and to control insect, weeds and other pests. The session were held on 21st January 2018 at CMSLP School Karikatur. Student socialworkers focused on topic Importance of Organic Farming. The program coordinator were Mr. Jobin. C. Valson and Aneesha. A. The class session were handled by Adv. Binoy Jose and the session were inaugurated by the president Miss Litha Shaji. Tye session started with a prayer followed by felicitation ceremony by the program coordinator and the presidential address given by ward member od Manimala grama panchayat and the felicitation speech gave by the stakeholders of Panchayat.

The session provide a well opportunity to spread the importance of organic farming. As a community program it was a great opportunity for the student social workers to organize the program. Delivering these types of community programs enable students to understand the strategies and the effectiveness and how it would impact the social life of normal people. Through the session it is gained a well understanding about the importance of organic farming ie : It helps

to maintain environment health by reducing the level of pollution. It reduces human and animal health hazards by reducing the level of residues in the product. It helps in keeping agricultural production at a sustainable level. Maintain and improve fertility, soil structure and biodiversity, and reduce erosion

Reduce the risks of human, animal, and environmental exposure to toxic materials,

Fine-tune farming practices to meet local production conditions and satisfy local markets.

Majority of the population in Kerala are dependent directly or indirectly on agriculture for their livelihood. The main crops grown in the state are Coconut, Paddy, Banana, Mango, Jackfruit, Pepper, Cashew, Areca nut, Rubber etc Kerala is an Agrarian economy. Coconut is the most important crop in Kerala. Now a days the practice of organic farming has been reduced so that it helped to understand the benefits and importance of organic farming. Through SHGs and bank loans it is providing loans for agricultural practices and most of them weren't aware of the practices and the possitive effects of organic farming. The community program came to a grand success by the active participation of the members. After the class session it is provided with a clarification session so that the members can clarify the doubts among farming. All the members were actively participated in the session and through an effective oraganized manner the session came to a grand success

COLLABORATION WITH JALANIDHI PROJECT

As part of field work practical, the student social workers had got the opportunity to work in association with the Jalanidhi Project in May 2018. The students conducted various awareness programmes and field surveys to collaborate the jalanidhi project with the various communities in Wayanad.

Jalanidhi Project is an important player in the rural water supply and sanitation sector in Kerala. It has successfully developed a viable alternate model for service delivery based on the sound principles of community cost sharing and management of operation and maintenance by beneficiaries themselves.

The World Bank approved Kerala Rural Water Supply and Environmental Sanitation Project (Jalanidhi) aimed to assist the Government of Kerala in improving the quality of rural water supply and delivery of environmental sanitation services to achieve sustainability of investments. The Performance Audit focused on the implementation of Water Supply Schemes and GroundWater Recharge by the Kerala Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Agency. It revealed deficiencies in planning, procedural irregularities, failure in completion of projects on time. The project also envisaged rehabilitation of existing KWA water supply schemes by augmenting the source, protection of sources from pollution, construction of new facilities, repairs and replacement of the existing structures, machinery, equipment and pipelines to conform to the technical standards.

Grama Panchayath is the nodal agency responsible for implementation of the project. The Grama Panchayats in Kerala gathered a high degree of implementation efficiency through the devolved powers for the past ten years. The GPs now expand around 5-7 crores per annum through the plan process. This capacity of decentralized planning will be very helpful for shouldering the responsibility of project implementation.

The student social workers had a great opportunity to work in collaboration with the Jalanidhi Project. They explore the functions and management of jalanidhi project and also the community where the project is implemented.



REFRESHMENT ACTIVITY FOR SABARIMALA PILGRIMS

The student social workers of second year PG have initiated an extension activity for the refreshment of sabarimala pilgrims. The activity was conducted on November 26th 2018. The students organized refreshments for the pilgrims such as providing drinking water for them, and also giving them dry ginger coffee for the relief from the cold. Many pilgrims prefer to prilate by walking to Sabarimala to see Ayyappan. The students focus more on those pilgrims rather than those who use vehicles.

This activity was based on the humanity principle and the student even realised the needs and wants of the pilgrims by walk and by vehicle. The interaction with the pilgrims makes them conscious of the facilities needed for them on their journey from Erumely to Pamba. The activity conducted was successful as it pleased many "Ayyappans".

Also this activity was a chance for the students to express their culture to the non- Keralites. The interchanging cultural collaboration leads to more exploration regarding values and norms. It was a novel experience and a fruitful cultural exploration. The support from the panchayath representatives and college needed to be acknowledged. The activity started at 9 am and end at 3 pm.



AWARENESS CLASS ON KUDUMBASHEE:

MES College Erumely conducted an extension activity focused on kudumbasree mission. Kudumbashree is the State Poverty Eradication Mission of Government of Kerala. Started in 1998, Kudumbashree envisaged local economic development, social development and women empowerment through its network of neighbourhood groups and the system of federations of ADS and CDS. By understanding the importance and relevance of the kudumbasree system social work trainee of 1st semester from MSW Department took an effective initiative to conduct this program. As a part of this extension activity students focused Ranni Taluk of Pathanamthitta District. Mrs Omana Rajan Secretary of the panchayat inaugurated the function. The main of the extension program was to make an awareness about the "problems due to communication gap in families." The focused kudumbasree group was named Dhiya kudumbasree. The session begins at 4 pm on 30th August 2018. With an effective interaction the session came to a grand success. The resource person provide a well understanding about the current problems faced by the youths among family. Student social workers came to an end of the session by providing various remedies for the communication gap between families.

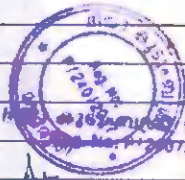

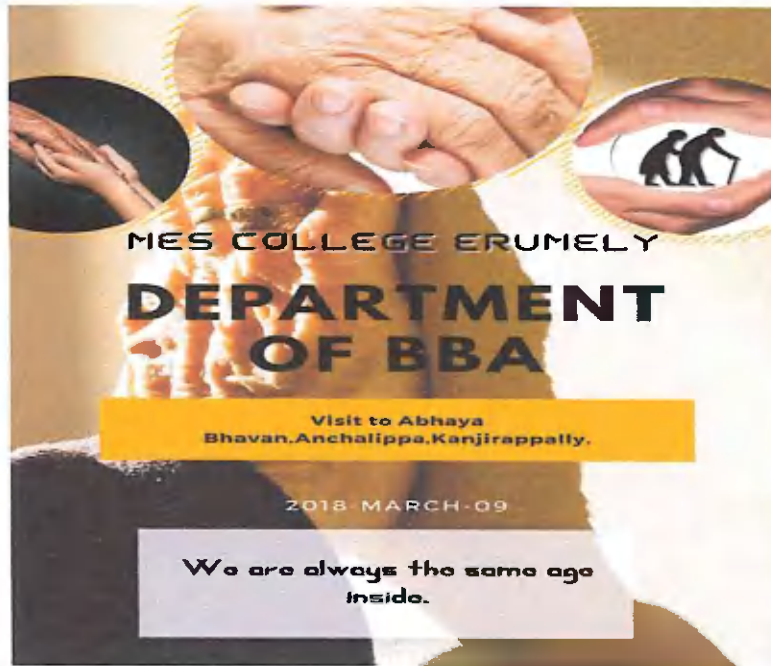
