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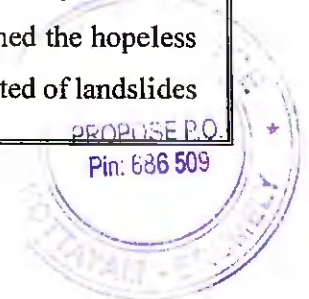
FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES AT ELAPPARA, IDUKKI DISTRICT

Kerala flood 2019 was adversely affected by many communities across the state. The Department of Social Work decided to engage with one among them, which is in Elappara of Idukki District. On 17 th August 2019, 30 students and faculties of Msw department visited the flood affected areas and relief camp at Elappara .The aim of the visit was to get an understanding about the impact of flood and to enhance their psycho social well being ensuring mental support and providing some support in terms of materials for their socio economic security. On 7th August 2019, Idukki district was lashed by heavy rains leading to the flooding of low-lying areas and landslides in the high ranges. Many parts witnessed minor landslides and some areas were cut off from the rest of the district. Quarrying, razing hills for constructions, massive scale road constructions, and expansions in the mountains and mono-crop cultivations were debated those days as contributing factors in the landslides and also by the incessant rains of high magnitude induced by climate change. But at the end the representatives could see how this disaster became a social vulnerability for those who were in the community. Elappara was one of the most affected regions in the district. The social demography of the area was more of workers in the plantation and their families. They live in *Layam* (small settlements) in the plantation with inadequate facilities. Due to severe landslides almost all the Layam of the affected areas were at risk of further sliding and all of them were partially or entirely affected by the disaster. Among the affected households 60 % had totally collapsed and 40 % we're partially damaged.

The students along with the faculties had a mini plan of intervention for their social support and the journey planned from MES College Erumely. Representatives visited Peerumade Grama Panchayat office and handovered twenty five kits to the flood relief authority as a helping hand for the survivors. The kits contained nutritious food items that do not need refrigeration and are easy to prepare. It also had Sanitary Napkins, Diapers, Emergency First Aid After handovering the kits the students visited Elappara flood relief camp Students reached there at 1.00 PM. The landslide survivors were residing in the parish Hall of church of God, Elappara. The relief camp was accommodated with twelve families. Of which the residents of 5 families completely collapsed and others were in partially destroyed states which cannot withstand further hit. The facilities provided in camp were much limited for 12 families to survive. They were lacking basic amenities. .The survivors of the disaster were in a traumatic situation. Most of the survivors lacked hope and felt helplessness. Students build rapport with them. The affected community members shared their circumstances and worries with the students. The students enlightened the hopeless by providing instructions about the support the government provides for the affected of landslides

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for upliftment. The landslide created both social and economic impacts. Most of the families there were joined and have more than 6 members. The layams were at risk of sliding and can't suffer a further hit. For resettlement they need to rebuild the layams or need to settle on another which may not have basic facilities for a joint family to reside. Families were economically weak to rebuild the layams. Many of them were suffering from chronic diseases and not getting essential medical supplies at camp. The students interacted with them for sometime. Landslide affected regions were visited by the students and prepared detailed notes on the same.. Cultivating areas, houses, roads totally collapsed in the regions. The inhabitants were feared to suffer from further hit.

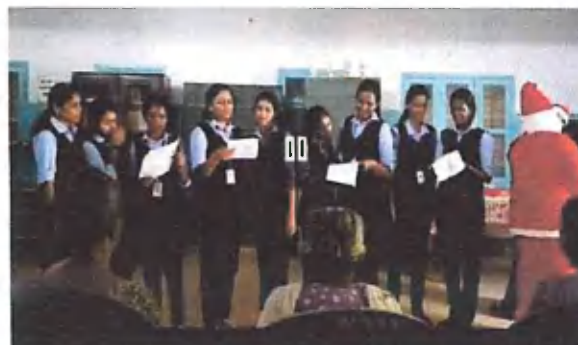

SOLAR LIGHT DISTRIBUTION AT VELLARADA GRAMA PANCHAYAT

Social Work Department of MES College Erumely conducted a rural camp named Chalanam 2020 at Vellarada Gramapanchayat in Thiruvananthapuram District. The camp was planned for 7 days . As part of the camp the students took a survey in 500 houses in vellarada Panchayat and interacted with them. The living conditions of the people in Vellarada Grama Panchayat were challenging. Many of them were uneducated, poor answers struggling to meet their minimal needs.. Some of them did not own a house at the least; the house they live in is almost broken or rented. Some of them were living alone due to being abandoned by their offspring. The social work students from MES College Erumely identified their difficulties by analysing the condition of the people living in Vellarada Grama Panchayat, and gave proper guidance and awareness to the common people about their rights and entitlements from the government. Vellarada is a Gram Panchayat of mixed economic condition. The issue was identified through survey and other community social work methods and students identified the electricity issue as one of the key challenging factors. There were more than 15 households that struggled as they didn't have Electricity power connection. Department decided to organise an event for distributing solar lights. Inauguration was in a Gram Sabha, Principal Mr.Maheen M N sir, Faculties and Students from MES College attended the session. The presence of ward Members and VEO was also there representing the community. For accessing solar lamps the Department of Social Work collaborated with the Department of Electronics .They prepared solar lamps with the guidance of IIT Bombay and we had issued it for around fifteen families. It was an effective extension activity for the department as it had a sense of deep community engagement, planning and implementation of the identified needs.



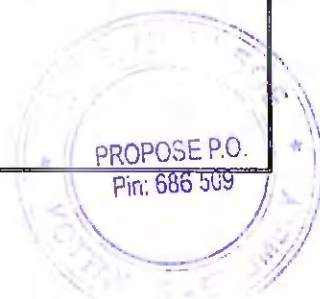
