Students are given the opportunity to learn to think systematically and develop skills of professional social work. The entire curriculum contributes to preparation for social work practice, but it is during the practicum that students face the real challenges and are afforded opportunities of professional responsibility and ethical practice. Practicum is a form of community service that occurs under the direct supervision of a social worker in a service agency. Agencies are specifically chosen to provide students the opportunity to engage in direct social work practice experiences with individuals, families, groups, organizations, and communities. It is important to note that practicum fieldwork is not meant to be on-the-job training or apprenticeship; rather it is an educational process of guided experiential learning designed for a student's personal and professional growth as a social worker. Department of Social Work, department MES College Erumely organized a webinar series "Practice, Praxis and Practicals: Perspectivizing Social Organizations". The programme was conducted from 5 June 2021 to 9 June 2021. The webinar session was conducted by five resource persons from five different organizations.



Session 1:" Locating communities in Attappadi: engaging with experiences of HRDS India": The first online webinar session was conducted by Mr. Arun T Mohandas, the Associate Project Director, HRDS palakkad. The webinar began with a prayer song. The session was conducted on June 5 from 4:30-5:30 PM regarding the topic "Locating communities in Attappadi: engaging with experiences of HRDS India". Ms Salma Ali, student of first year MSW welcomed the virtual program, Presidential Address was done by Ms. Sulthana T Sulaiman, HOD of Department of Social Work and Mr. Jithesh K.S inaugurated the webinar. Ms Nikitha Prasad had given the special address and vote of thanks by Mr Amith Lal Dious, student of first year.

High Range Rural Development Society is an Non Governmental Organization established in 1995 working for tribal development. Attappadi located at Mannarkkad in Palakkad district has one of the largest tribal settlements in Kerala. HRDS was first introduced in Kattappana, Idukki district. As an NGO in India. HRDS aims to build a world where every member of the tribe attains

a right to survival, protection and development. The key objective is the enhancement of tribal and rural development. The main aim is to help marginalized sections of the society through sustainable development initiatives.

HRDS initiated several welfare projects for tribal families. Their projects were implemented in various sectors such as education, health, livelihood, and women empowerment. The projects includes Sadhgraha, Tribal housing, Jwalamukhi, Women empowerment programme, "Ekagrah"educational program, "Nirmaya "centre for traditional medicine and research, "Karshaka" for the cultivation of medicinal plants, organic natural farming, Agricultural and animal husbandry. The vision and mission includes expansion of housing projects, Tribal development program, Save child village project, child and women health care, care of aged, clinical services, expansion of community health, expansion of intervention in HIV/AIDS prevention.



Session 2 : Village Republics: Discussing Decentralisation Development and Governance:

On the second day of the first semester organisation visit, the social work students attended the online webinar section conducted by Dr Anto S V, the district coordinator of KILA Thrissur. This section was conducted on June 6th from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m regarding the topic "Village Republics: Discussing Decentralisation Development and Governance. KILA Kerala Institute of local administration is an autonomous institution functioning for the local governments in Kerala it was registered under the travancore-cochin re literary scientific and charitable society act 1955. The central University of Kerala has recognised it as a resource centre attached to the development of international relations on 14th July 2014 and over since it's incentive in 1990. KILA engaged in capacity building intervention of local governance and decentralization include in training action research publication seminar and workshop consultancy documentation landholding and information services. KILA has continuous growth under the leadership of directors from various backgrounds such as civil service, academia and Kerala's own people's plan campaign. The thematic area of training has been and expanded to include various aspects of decentralization and functioning of local self governance; it was built with the

contribution from the grama panchayat. KILA has sufficient government control which provides for an executive council with the five members chaired by the principal secretary, general counsel having to all members shared by the minister of ISGD. The responsibility of the management of KILA is the duty of director. The first six directors were selected from civil services for one to two years. They initiated steps for the development of the institutions.

KILA has established in area:- participate replanning, local governance and development, urban governance and development, local economic development and livelihood promotion, participatory poverty management, child rights governance, inclusive governance and development, natural resource management and watershed development, financial management, training skill development, total quality management, human Development, good governance and social accountability, food security and suitable agricultural development




Session 3 : 1098 Hello Child line: On the third day of the observation visit (07/06/21) the students of MSW department got an opportunity to study on children on the topic "1098 Hello Child line"Field Observation visit is the most realistic method of teaching in which the trainee was able to observe the workplace and activities undertaken. The method of theoretical learning can be visualized. The important component of observation visit is the capacity to link the concept of theory and practicals.

The session was conducted by Mr Sajan Antony, District coordinator childline pathanamthitta. Childline is the agency which ensures the welfare of the children. It is responsible for establishing the childline service across the country, monitoring of service delivery and finance, training, research and documentation, creating awareness, advocacy as well as resource generation for the service. Childline 1098 is a phone number that spells hope for children. It is an emergency number working 24 hours daily for children in need of aid and assistance. They are also responsible for the long term care and rehabilitation. Childline works for the protection of rights of all children aged from 0 to 18. It is an initiative for rescuing and assisting children in distress. Their special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially the more vulnerable sections. Categories of cases in a childline; Childline who are a victim of physical abuse, Those children are victims of sexual abuse, Children focusing emotional abuse provide shelter to children who

are not able to live in a home, They are accommodated in child care institutions, Provide nutrition kit to children prevent child labour, Take precautions on child marriage, Give special care to children facing neglect from their parents and provide emotional support and guidance.

The observation visit conducted as webinar and the resource person was Mr Sajan Antony and the meeting brought a detailed information about the NGO in a deep manner and the program schedule charted by the 3rd group under the moderator Devika Mohandas, Abin D kumar delivered a welcome speech and Ms Aleena Denny introduced the resource person. After the session resource person provides an awareness to the social work students. With the effective participation and interaction the session came to a great success.



Session 4: Care and Social Support for Children with Disabilities: An Introduction to Akkara Foundation: On the 4 th day of observation, a visit conducted as part of the academic curriculum, the MSW department attended the online webinar session led by AKKARA FOUNDATION FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT project manager Mr. Mohammad Yasir. The webinar was conducted on the topic "Care and Social Support for Children with Disabilities: An Introduction to Akkara Foundation". The session was from 4.30 pm to 5.30 pm on 8 th June 2021. Akkara Foundation Bekal is a non profitable organization based at Bekal in Kasargod district of Kerala. The trust has been formed primarily to initiate medical and psychosocial assistance in the upliftment of physically and mentally challenged members of Indian Society. It was established in 2018. They provide services like physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, special education and other services.

Their vision is to build an inclusive society free from discrimination where persons with disabilities become contibuting members, living with dignity and respect. Also to support differently abled in all dimensions and empower them to eradicate poverty and ensure social justice. Promote and encourage public interest with regards to the abilities, limitations, achievements and needs of differently abled individuals.

Akkara foundation expects to complete a full fledged therapy center with International standards specialising in the intensive rehabilitation of children and adults with cerebral palsy, autism, muscular dystrophy, developmental disorders, epilepsy, neurological and locomotor disorder and undiagnosed diagnosis as part of the project.




Session 5: Mind and Mental wellbeing: An Abstract from a Psychiatric Setting: On the final day of observational visit 09/June/2021 the students from social work department got an opportunity to study on "NAKKADA MISSION HOSPITAL, THIRUVALLA" based on the topic "Mind and Mental wellbeing: An Abstract from a Psychiatric Setting" by the Resource person "Mr. A. J. John" working as the psychiatric doctor there. Due to the pandemic crisis, the social work department conducted a virtual platform for the observational visit and the session was carried out in an informative and understandable way related to medical and psychiatry setting.

NAKKADA MISSION HOSPITAL is a 50 bedded neuro-psychiatric hospital. This was established 24 years back and is functioning in a fruitful manner. The hospital is administered by a trust formed with committed and philanthropic individuals who are members of NAKKADA family. NAKKADA is a group of institutions and members of the Marthoma Church. They offer outpatient and inpatient treatment for those who have Psychiatric or behavioural problems and drug or alcohol addiction. Our comprehensive treatment programs are traitored to the patients' needs enabling them to cope effectively with their illness and environment on the path to recovery. The salient features of the hospital are calm and peaceful atmosphere, and individual attention to the patients. Admits patients with/without bystanders, modern methods of holistic treatment, the OP and IP treatment service for psychiatric illness, alcoholism and drug abuse. Pharmacotherapy and psychological interventions for children and adolescents with developmental and behavioral problems. NAKKADA mission hospital has a team of efficient and qualified doctors, clinical psychologists, psychiatric social workers and psychiatric nurses working under the guidance of the chief psychiatrist of the institution. Their duration of the treatment is from one week to one month, depending on the physical and psychological conditions of the patient.

The major treatment modalities are pharmacotherapy, family therapy, psychotherapy, group therapy, counselling,games and physical exercises. The major works carried out by mental health services to individuals with high needs. They may perform psychotherapy and even diagnose mental illness. They do psychological assessment and provide therapy. Also they are in frequent contact with family members of the patients, they meet other members of the mental health team to discuss patient care, if the patient is involved in any legal procedures the authority provides

legal aid for them. There are a hundred cases reported in the psychiatric hospital. The clients' approaches differ from one another. Some may have slight abnormalities and rest may have a long term treatment. The treatment may be or mayn't be with bystanders. The slight abnormality clients' give the short term therapy and the prescribed medicines by Psychiatric doctors.

The whole program scheduled under the moderation of 'Ms. Silla Anna(student of first year MSW)', started with the Welcome Speech by 'Ms. Amritha Sajeev(student of first year MSW)' and the resource person was specially invited and introduced by 'Ms.Gayathri C M (student of first year MSW)', Vote of thanks by 'Mr. Anandhu Ravi (student of first year MSW)' and the whole faculties in the department of Social work show their special gratitude.



Rural Camp: Ujvalam 2021



Contemporary social work practice is increasingly becoming complex and challenging. Social workers are engaged in working with society's most vulnerable, disadvantaged and deprived sections of the population who require help with multiple needs. The situations and needs requiring social work intervention could be intra-personal, interpersonal, inter-group or inter-organizational. Field work is the most essential part of social work education and training. Community based field work helps in understanding the local problems, social and environmental aspects. Learning and practice of social work methods and skills of work with individuals and the socio-economic-political systems of family, community, state, democratize them, drawing linkages across them, to prevent and ameliorate social problems and documentation, monitoring and evaluation of one's social work intervention.

The Rural Engagement Program is a part and parcel of social work education. It provides opportunities to the students to learn practical aspects of different subjects in the field of social work, helps to carry out the practices to gain the practical knowledge. Considering the objectives of rural camp, the Department of Social Work has selected the Erumely Gramapanchayat for the rural camp for the current academic year. The department organized 5 days of rural camp at Sreenipuram and Nerchappara villages of Erumely Gramapanchayat, aimed at finding out the vaccination status of the people, health conditions and learning the socio-economic factors. The students used a survey method to collect the required data.

The Rural Engagement Programme, Ujwalam 2021was organized from 22nd of September to 26th September 2021 in collaboration with the Department of Social Work, Erumely Gramapanchayat and Health Department at Sreenipuram and Nerchappara. The camp was focused on providing community exposure to the students of II Semester MSW. The theme of the rural engagement program was regarding vaccination status.

The students were divided into different committees and assigned various responsibilities. There were committees for Food, Public Relation, Finance, Designing, Documentation, Discipline and Program Committee. Each committee has made proper planning and done the necessities before starting the camp. There were two student coordinators and a faculty coordinator for monitoring and facilitating the camp activities.

Ujwalam 2021 was set for five days with various activities like Field Survey, Seminars, Street Play, Cultural Activities, etc. The field survey was conducted for three days at Sreenipuram and Nerchappara, two villages at Erumely Gramapanchayat. The survey was conducted in association with the Erumely Gramapanchayat and Health Department. The survey forms were developed by the CHC. The survey was conducted in order to prepare study reports on the vaccination status of people. The seminar sessions were conducted for three days on different topics in current relevant issues. The sessions were handled by various resource persons who have excellence in the field. The students did a street play performance on the fourth day of the camp on the topic: Dowry Death. It was performed at three different places at Erumely Gramapanchayat. In the evening sessions, the students had cultural activities organized by each group.

It was the first day of the rural engagement program. The day comprises inaugural ceremony, field survey and ice breaking session and cultural activities. The rural camp was inaugurated by the President, Erumely Gramapanchayat, Mrs. Thankamma Georgekutty. The session was splendid with the presence of Mr. P. H. Nageeb, Chairman, MES College Erumely; Mr. Maheen M. N, Principal, MES College Erumely; Mr. Jithesh K. S, Director, Academics; Mr. Seytha Muhammed, Ward Member, Sreenipuram; other ward representatives and faculties of Department of Social Work. The survey forms were also distributed in the ceremony. In the afternoon, the field survey was conducted at Sreenipuram. The students were divided into groups of two members each. They were given guidelines for conducting the survey. The evening sessions were used to have the ice breaking and cultural programs conducted by the group 1. The day ended with camp analysis, in which the faculties and students discussed various factors regarding the camp.





The second day of rural camp began with a field survey at Sreenipuram. The students could cover maximum households at Sreeniuram within two days. They visited each house and interacted with the members of the community. A seminar was conducted in the evening session on the topic "Mental Health in Online Era" by Consultant Psychologist, Mrs. Elizabeth Chirayil. It was very informative, as she discussed social media addiction, screen addiction and its health impacts. In the evening session, cultural program and camp analysis were done.







The third day of rural camp began with a field survey at Nerchappara. Nerchappara was an entirely different place than Sreenipuram. The students could explore the community within the time period. A seminar was conducted in the evening session on the topic "Dowry Death and Domestic Violence" by Adv. Poornima S. Nair. She explained about the dowry system followed in India and the laws regarding domestic violence. The evening sessions were splendid with cultural programs organized by Group 3.





A street play was performed by the students on the fourth day of the Rural Engagement Program. It was performed on the theme "Dowry Death". It was done at three different places, where the community people could be benefitted. Then in the afternoon session, a seminar conducted on the topic "Palliative Care", taken by Dr. Koyakutty, Chief Specialist, Bharat Matha Hospital, Kottayam. He discussed the scope and role of social workers in the field. The day ended with cultural activities of group 2 and camp analysis.







As it was the last day of Rural Engagement Program, a valedictory function was organized as the last event of the rural camp. Mr Jithesh K.S, Director, Academics was present as the chief guest. Mozhi, a collection of oral history narratives were released by the Department of Social Work during the function. The various camp awards were distributed on the day.








REPORT ON PARENTS MEETING: 27.07.2021

National Webinar On "Naac Criterion -Vii Institutional Values And Best Practices"



World Population Day




The programme ended in 19/07/2021. The trainees shared their experience, they got a counselling exposure, it is very useful for their future.

Sakhi Saheli: Field Level Intervention With Kudumbashree Members

Sakhi Saheli is an initiative by the social arm of MES College Erumely, since 2017 which conceived and performed by the students of the institute. SAKHI SAHELI- the very name rings a bell. It is synonymous with concern, care, respect and companionship, with a human touch. The goal of this initiative is to learn from the empowered women from Kudumbashree, thus nourishing the knowledge and experiences of students and also it is an initiative that reaches out to the disenfranchising women and needy. Over the years, this activity of MSW students has become more organized and consolidated. This is considered as a great opportunity for the students to engage with empowered women even though they are vulnerable. The focus is to serve the women who are underprivileged. We, as a team, have a mission to accomplish not only empowerment or nourishment and physical presence but also to share our happiness with them. Our vision is the empowerment of women in rural as well as urban areas, bringing women together from all spheres of life to fight for their rights or for empowerment and also to develop skill among them. Empowerment of women and their participation in the development process has been considered an essential feature of development. It is presumed that real development is possible only if the women and men work in equal terms. Empowerment of women is recognized globally as a key element to achieve progress in all areas. Rural women are regarded as voiceless and defenceless. So they are to be empowered to fight against the evils faced by them. Kudumbashree project was started in Kerala in 1998. Women empowerment is one of the important objectives of Kudumbashree along with poverty eradication. The aim of the Kudumbashree scheme is to improve the standard of living of poor women in rural areas by setting up micro-credit and productive enterprises. It opened a new string of expected events in our development history. Kudumbashree is the poverty eradication mission of the state of Kerala and also women want to identify their inner strength, opportunities for growth and their role in reshaping their own destiny through Kudumbashree.


The mission of this initiative is to educate and empower women, with the skills and confidence, create a healthy lifestyle and acquaint the learners with the various social problems faced by women that often come across by given extension field work activity and to reach the root cause of these problems. In this manner the learners are encouraged to apply their theoretical knowledge in practice.

The objective of the initiative 'Sakhi Saheli' is to understand the nature of collectivisation among Kudumbashree members, to identify the key thematic areas which need intervention through the preliminary study, to develop and implement plan of action for the challenges identified during the study, to analyse on how Kudumbashree empowering the women among the poor to improve their individual and collective capabilities by organising them into Neighbourhood Groups at the local level, Area Development Societies at the local government ward level and Community Development Societies at the local government level, also to develop skill in them, standing together and never giving up even when all odds stand in their way, to study the structure, functions and process of Kudumbashree and convergence of services at local level and how far they have been incorporated in the overall programme, to study the measures taken by Kudumbashree for economic empowerment of women with special focus on micro-credit and micro-enterprises development, to study how the Kudumbashree programme enhanced the decision making leadership and political empowerment of women.

As part of Masters of Social Work external activity, the Department of Social work directed the students to do their field work in different Kudumbashree units. The students got the opportunity to do external field work in various Kudumbashree, which has been contributing in the field of women empowerment and poverty alleviation. Through this field work the trainees got an opportunity to know more about the Kudumbashree.

Initially in 2017, the focus of students is to familiarize the structure and functioning of Kudumbashree. Also study the various stages of formation and growth of Kudumbashree and identify various factors for its growth.





Over the years, the initiative ushered towards more organised and practical level in the field with the target of understanding the units and its activities, to integrate theoretical knowledge into practical level.to improve the practical skill, develop the skills in organization and communication.to study the role of social worker in the agency, to conduct activities with proper planning with the involvement of women. Students usually choose the Kudumbashree unit from their own respective ward. In the present scenario they utilize various online platforms for conducting their interventions and programmes.

Students engage in various programmes that are assets in rural as well as in urban areas for the development and empowerment of women and thus strengthening families. These programmes in general help to motivate these women in bringing out their inborn skills and employ it to create a stream of earning. Many of the beneficiaries of these programmes, who have gone to do well in their area of interest. It is essential to mention here that the programmes have been highly successful in instilling in the beneficiaries self-worth and self-confidence, which has enriched them to earn better positive acceptance and stature in their families as well as in their communities. This is a brief glimpse into the various activities that have been implemented: Skill training on reed craft, tailoring, manufacturing of handicrafts, organic farming and creation of jewellery. The students conducted workshops and awareness classes subsequently understanding those particular Kudumbashree units.

Every year, the Masters of Social Work student's successfully complete field level intervention with Kudumbashree members. This field work gave the students a wonderful opportunity to understand more about the agency, especially their programs and developments. The trainees could fulfil most of the objectives of fieldwork which was given by the department.

Community Engagement Program in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of Education, Government of India

PG Department of Social Work, MES College Erumely, jointly coordinated with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of Education, Government of India conducted a Community Engagement Program at Vellavoor Gramapanchayat. Community Engagement in Higher Education is where sustainable networks, partnerships, communication media, and activities between Higher Education Institutions and communities are fostered at various levels. There is an inevitable and symbolic relationship that exists between communities and Higher Education Institutions. The students were divided into five teams, giving five different areas of activities. The 20 days activities were started on 6th of July 2021. The students were assigned to provide different services and connect the beneficiaries to the stakeholders. The target group behind this program was Covid-19 affected patients, families, their children and old age people.

The Community Program was introduced to the community people through posters describing the services provided by the teams and where also given contact numbers of the team members. The students could identify the needs of the beneficiaries and connect them to the proper stakeholders who can provide them the needed services. The program was completely done in online mode. Through telephonic conversations, and online meetings, the students could engage with the beneficiaries. Awareness posters and videos were created on topics related to Covid-19 and shared among the beneficiaries through the stakeholders of the Panchayat. By the end of the Program, each team could organize a community event addressing different topics in relation to Covid-19. The teams could ensure the participation of both the stakeholders and the beneficiaries. The Community Engagement Program has given the best opportunity to get involved with the community people, to understand their needs during the pandemic and could provide the necessary services.

TEAM 1: HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT TEAM



INTRODUCTION

The Community Intervention Program jointly with Vellavoor Gramapanchayat, in association with MGNCRE SAP, MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA, MES College Erumely conducted from 2021 July 6. The department of social work, MES College had 5 groups in different categories. Group: 1 Hospital Management Team with 5 members worked with the community in Vellavoor Grama Panchayat with the help of ASHA workers and CDS members in the Panchayat. Since the Team is based on Hospital Management, we analyzed the problems faced by the community during the Covid 19 pandemic, with the help of ASHA workers, who had a great involvement in the recent times. We collected the data of Covid positive patients and helped the needy by reference to the help desk for different needs. As part of the team work we had to make posters on the base of Hospital management and circulated them to the Vellavoor community through the ASHA workers and CDS members. We analysed the problems faced by the community during the pandemic, most of the people were afraid about the pandemic and had doubts about the vaccine. What are the impacts of vaccination, why fever and some other health issues affect after the vaccination, is coronavirus affect the immunity system of the body where the major questions arises from the community. From these questions we had analysed the people in the Vellavoor community is mentally confused about the prevention and the vaccination. As a result team Hospital management conducted a webinar on the topic of "Vaccination and Mental Health" by the Community Counselor of Vellavoor panchayat, Mrs. Anupama C and the program was inaugurated by the vice president of Vellavoor grama panchayat, Mrs. Shinimol T C. The presidential addresses were handled by CDS Chairperson, Mrs. Ammini George. The program started from July 6, 2021 and ended with the Webinar conducted on 25 July 2021, 11 am to 12 pm.

- To collect contacts of different stakeholders from Vellavoor Grama Panchayat.
- Gather information of the Covid positive cases.
- To enquire about the necessities for the needy.
- To create several brochures/posters & circulated
- Analyze the Covid prevention programs in Vellavoor Panchayat.
- To clear misconceptions about vaccination.


- Make posters and circulated over Community.

TEAM 2: NON HOSPITAL MANAGEMENT INTRODUCTION

From 6th July 2021, MGNCRE SAP MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND GOVT OF INDIA and MES College Erumely conducted a community program centered on Vellavoor Grama Panchayat. Vellavoor Gramapanchayat is located in Changanacherry block of Kottayam district in Kerala, India. There are a total of 13 wards in vellavoor. With the cooperation of the ward members and ASHA workers, the team 'KARUTHAL' was able to function as well and also we were able to conclude the activities by organising a training program on 25th July 2021. Different activities were carried out in 5 different groups. The non-hospital management team was a group of 5 of us under the guidance of faculty Mr. Al Ameen J. The community program, which ran from July 6 to 25, was well conducted. The broad aim of Fieldwork and other Academic work is to provide opportunities for the students to apply the knowledge learnt from the classroom situations and to plan, implement and evaluate these experiences while working with individuals, groups and Communities. We were able to make good use of the opportunity we had as Social Work students. We got the best exposure from the community setting.

ACTIVITIES

- Telephonic interview with ward members, ASHA workers, and other Stakeholders of Vellavoor Grama Panchayat
- Generated an awareness through social media
- Created pamphlets, Brochures and videos about covid 19
- Conducted a community intervention program based on the topic "Covid-19 and Nutrient Supply"

The activities are done day by day, by each member in the team. The activities were started on 6th July 2021.

As a part of Community intervention program conducted at Vellavoor Grama panchayat in Association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of Higher Education, Government of India, the student social workers from team 2 Non Hospital management "Karuthal" The team was able to create pamphlets and Brochures .These posters and brochures helped to make the public aware of the importance of vaccination, and to aware people about prevention of Covid 19. Mainly we make the pamphlet and distribute through social media and circulate to ward members, Asha workers etc. Now vaccination is important in life. So making it very clear to the public is very relevant.

COMMUNITY PROGRAM



As part of Community intervention program conducted at Vellavoor Grama Panchayat in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of education, government of India, student social workers from Non Hospital Management team "Karuthal" planned to organize a training session for ICDS Anganwadi workers

Based on the topic 'Covid and nutrition'. The session was coordinated with the guidance of ICDS supervisor Mrs. Rajeeshwari and the training session was conducted by CDPO of Vazhoor Mrs. Lakshmi on Sunday 25 July 2021, at 6 PM at Google meet. Bincy was the moderator and Navya got the opportunity to present the welcome speech.

Nutrition during this period led to so many implementations. Therefore, investing in nutrition is the key to secure a country's future generation. Food being distributed to scores of poor children and pregnant women through ICDS Anganwadis. It added that if proper nutrition was not supplied to them, they could see a spike in malnutrition burden. While children between three and six years, younger children, pregnant women and lactating or nursing mothers usually get nutritional food even in the pandemic crisis. The children and other beneficiaries from low socio-economic backgrounds are largely dependent upon the one-time meal that bridges the protein and calories deficiency among them. So the topic plays a significant role in the community.

CDPO Lakshmi handled the training program very well. The event started at 6pm and ended at 7pm. Total 58 people attended the training program. Anganwadi workers from Vellavoor Grama Panchayat and Nedumkunnam Panchayat also participated in the program. After classes 3 people asked questions. The session ended with a vote of thanks by Sridevi.



TEAM 3: FAMILY SUPPORT TEAM



INTRODUCTION

As part of a community engagement programme in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of Education and Government of India, a community intervention programme was conducted in Vellavoor Grama Panchayath, Kottayam district. This intervention programme was initiated by the PG department of social work of MES College Erumely as a 20 days programme started on 6th July 2021 and ended on 25th July 2021. The third team named Oppam with 6 members engaged in the community as a family support team.

OBJECTIVES

- To realize families by coming together, can open many routes of positive thinking and make changes that suits their lifestyle
- To aware the families the importance of good health during pandemic
- To provide tips for parents who are still not settled with navigating their work life balance and children unable to gear up with virtual learning
- To support the families suffers from financial problems.
- To aware about the importance of mental health in healthy family relationship

ACTIVITIES

- 1. Tele counseling for family and children.
- 2. Through telecommunication each social work train communicates with the families to know about the current situation of the lifestyle.
- 3. Awareness on Covid vaccine and help them to register for vaccination.
- 4. Recreational activities for family members especially women and children through games and tasks.

- 5. Awareness on post Covid mental and physical health.
- 6. Awareness on women and child protection as in this pandemic time domestic violence cases have increased reporting.
- 7. Talk with family and students to know their needs related to academics(eg: notebooks, mobile) and try to arrange their needs by coordinating with other stakeholders
- 8. Community Programs (webinar).

This intervention programme was initiated by the family support team. This webinar was conducted along with the integration of Vellavoor Grama Panchayath. This webinar was taken by Tessy George, Junior Public Health Inspector on the topic "Covid: adhijeevanathinte kudumba paadangal" at 4 pm of 25th July 2021. And the programme was inaugurated by the Vellavoor Grama panchayat vice president Mrs. Shinimol T.S. Family is the primary and most crucial institution at the time of crisis and emergency. The quantity and quality time with family is one of the important aspects of a relationship. So this opportunity is utilized to rekindle the healthy relationship we lost with family while fighting with the pandemic. The focused group is the people from Vellavoor Panchayat along with panchayath representatives and covid warriors.

8.Online workshop (on paper bag or mask making which will be a relief to the family suffers from financial problems)


In the Community engagement programme, the family support team creates a mask making video

TEAM 4: MEDICAL SUPPLIES TEAM



INTRODUCTION

MES College Erumely PG Department of Social Work in association with MGNCRE SAP conducted community intervention program in Vellavoor Grama Panchayat from 5th July 2021 to 25th July 2021. As part of the program social work trainees were divided into 5 teams: Medical supplies team, hospital management team, non-hospital management team, family support team and psychosocial support team.

The medical supplies Team which started its activity under the name 'AARDRAM' was looking forward to providing medical assistance to the people of vellavoor grama panchayat. Team was under the guidance of course teacher Al Ameen. Team started activity on 6th July 2021. The entire activity of the team was through online platforms. Vellavoor grama panchayat is located in Changanacherry block of Kottayam district in Kerala, India. There are a total of 13 wards in Vellavoor grama panchayat. The medical needs of the people in each ward were collected from the ward members and asha workers. With the cooperation of the ward members and asha workers the team 'AARDRAM' was able to function as well. The team 'AARDRAM' concluded the activities by organizing a webinar on 25th July 2021.

OBJECTIVES

- To generate awareness to the public on primary care of covid patients.
- To provide information about covid vaccination.
- Importance of health and Hygiene in covid situation
- Awareness on taking necessary precautions against the pandemic

ACTIVITIES

- Vaccine registration
- Posters showing steps on vaccine registration
- Distribution of pamphlets
- Brochures regarding information about medicines and other precautions to be taken
- Pamphlet distribution, based on vaccine registration.
- Contact stakeholders

The activities started on 6 July 2021 as online mode. Several activities were planned and executed by the members of the group by engaging in conversation with various stakeholders. The group members collectively engaged in the collection of information regarding the Panchayat. They contacted various stakeholders and discussed the current situation of the area. Vaccine registration was the major activity focused by the group. The members created pamphlets and awareness brochures for helping the public for vaccine registration. The pamphlet includes the steps in vaccine registration and it was distributed among the ward member's and Asha workers. Brochures regarding medical precautions were also created and distributed. Finally, the group members collectively organized a community program in the form of a webinar through an online platform.

PAMPHLET MAKING



As part of a Community intervention program conducted at Vellavoor Grama Panchayat in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of education, government of India, the Social Work Trainees from medical supplies team "AARDAM". "Getting your immunisation even after you have had Covid, it's an amazing boost to your immune system and it might help to continue to protect yourself and people around you and potentially for a longer period of time than your natural immunity would have provided without the extra vaccine doses" Yes covid vaccination is very important to our life it is help to immune our body system. But we have a very doubtful question: how to register the vaccination? What is the process? In the community intervention program we decided to help people to register the covid portal. It is a simple process and we think that it may help at least one person in the vellavoor panchayat.

The first program is to make a pamphlet topic based on "How to register in covid portal" We think it is very helpful to people to register in covid vaccine. It is a simple step and explains the process very clearly. Then share the pamphlet with Asha workers through vellavoor panchayat. We make the pamphlet and distribute through social media and circulate to ward members, asha workers etc. The vaccine registration makes it easier for people to understand and makes the registration simple. We think it makes the people get clear and understand how to register. Now vaccination is important in life and it make clear.

AWARENESS POSTER



The team also made an awareness poster for the public about the covaxin vaccine. It was made to inform the people about who can take these vaccines, who cannot, and its side effects. People are having a lot of doubts and misconceptions regarding the vaccines and its effects. So we think to a certain extent this will be helpful to some people to know about the vaccine.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM

As part of Community intervention program conducted at Vellavoor Grama Panchayat in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of education, government of India, the Social Work


Trainees from medical supplies team "AARDAM" planned to organize an awareness session in the form of a webinar on the topic 'primary care of covid patients'. The session is conducted by Ampili Roopesh, Nursing Officer (Hospital infection control nurse), General Hospital Adoor on Sunday 25 July 2021, at 6 PM.

Primary care can play a significant role in the COVID-19 response by differentiating patients with symptoms, making an early diagnosis, helping vulnerable people cope with their anxiety about the virus, and reducing the demand for hospital services. The role of primary care has been increasingly important as cities imposed strict control measures including non-pharmaceutical interventions and as large hospitals closed their outpatient departments during periods of increased transmission. There is an increasing role of home care for COVID-19 cases within communities supported by a strong primary care system, which strengthens the trust between health-care workers and communities. On the identification of the need for primary care during the pandemic, the family support team had planned an intervention to the public regarding their concerns.

The webinar was scheduled at 6pm, on google meet. The programme was inaugurated by Jalaja Mohan, (Chairperson, Health and Education Standing Committee), presidential address by Rosamma (Chairperson, Development Standing Committee). TEAM 5: PSYCHO SOCIAL SUPPORT TEAM



INTRODUCTION

Department of Social Work, MES College Erumely in association with MGNCRE SAP Ministry of Education Government of India conducted a Community Engagement Program from 06 July 2021 to 25 July 2021. Five teams participated in the program, they are; Hospital management, Non- Hospital Management, Family support team, Medical supplies team and Psycho social support team. All the 5 teams worked within the premises of Vellavoor Grama Panchayat.

The primary goal of this team is to provide mental support to the common people and to make them aware about post &pre Covid care related to mental as well as physical health. The team employed various methods to reach out the concept of the theme to the particular target group members, our target group members are the natives of Vellavoor Grama Panchayat.

OBJECTIVES

- Provide mental health support to the people of Vellavoor Grama Panchayat.
- Aware them about pre & post Covid care by boosting out the physical as well as mental health
- Enquire the details of Covid Patients both having Covid positive and negative people/ their family.

- To find Counsellors contact details to provide further intervention.
- Adopt various methods to reach out to the target population.
- Provide Counselling sessions to the people who are mentally weak and refer them for further intervention.

ACTIVITIES

On the first day of the program we prepared a brochure with the program theme and contact details in it. The brochure was circulated through various social media platforms. Also informed about the program aim and particular details to the authority members of our target population (Vellavoor Grama Panchayat) and took the primary details of Covid positive patients and recently Covid negative people. Communicated with each of the members through telephone and enquired them about their present health condition.


We chose two Counsellors for providing special intervention to the needy people. Provided further counselling for a patient who lost her husband and old father due to Covid 19 disease. She was suffering from serious mental trauma. Another woman who lost her husband and her daughter preferred for counselling. The rest of the people were in a moderate situation.

We created an awareness video with the participation of the camp members and published it through social media platforms. The reason for adding their own voice is to increase the quality of the video and enlighten the people about mental health in relation to the Covid pandemic.

We also created an awareness poster by denoting important points related to mental health and physical health during Covid period. At last we created another video to share during the webinar and circulated it to all the social media and shared maximum for promotion of the class. We conducted our webinar through 'Google meet' on 25 July 2021, Sunday. The class started at 11:00am and Mr. Binod Chattookkulam inaugurated the webinar session. Mr. Arjun G M, (MD of Expectation Walkers NGO) & Ms. Sneha Mathew (Anastasia technician & medical coding student) took the sessions. The topic of the webinar was "Survival- mental & physical health care during the Covid-19". The webinar had two sessions; mental health and physical health. The session on Mental health was carried out by Mr. Arjun G M and session on Physical health was by Mr. Sneha Mathew . Both of them handled the class in an interesting way and the audience enjoyed it well, and received a lot of feedback.
