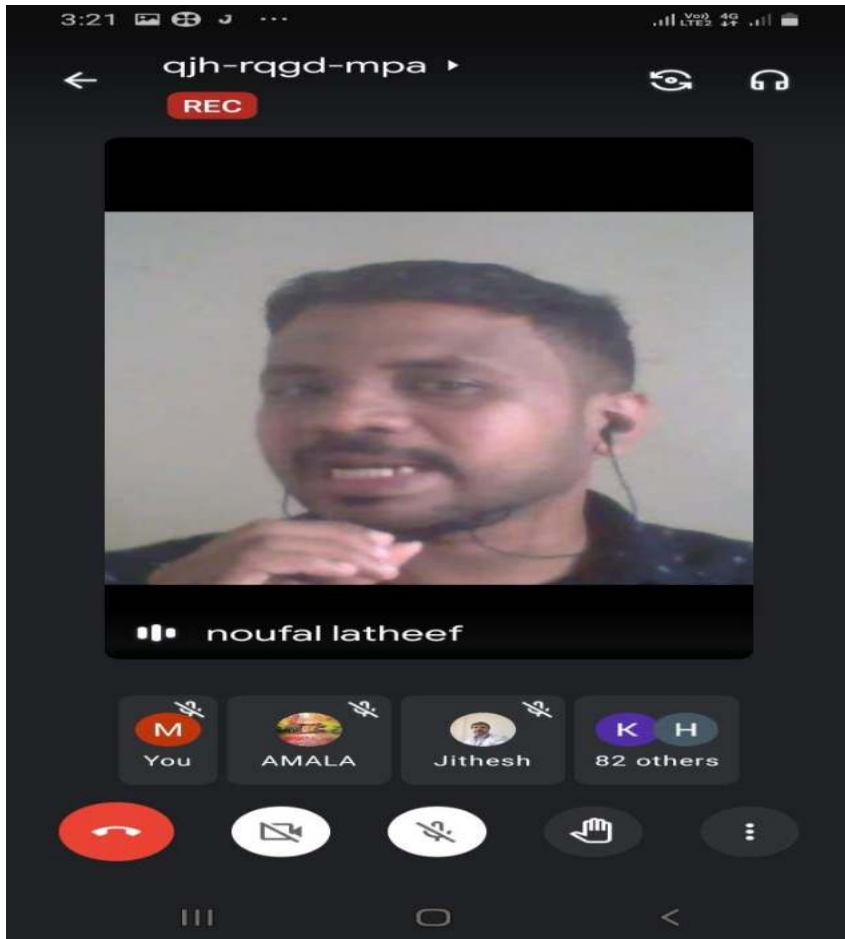

In her Speech, she highlighted the Significance and the Relevance of Budget. Inauguration was done by MubeenaGafoor (HOD, Department of Economics). In her speech she points out that it is an opportunity for all to analyse the prons and cribs of Central- State Budget 2021. All the students from the Economics Department of MES College participated in this programme. There are two teams namely central budget (team A) and state budget (team B). Budget was started at 10 am itself. Moderator gave introduction and startup to both teams. Team A start their area, on the fund allocation of sectoral wise development. They point out the areas like strengthen the sankalp of Nation First,

Doubling farmer's income, strong infrastructure, healthy India, good governance, opportunities for youth, education for all, women empowerment and inclusive development among others. Team B state that Kerala covid 19 response has won world acclaim. We are able to effectively contain the pandemic in its first phase. But the spread is on the rise in the subsequent phases. Kerala finance minister Thomas Issac has presented a Covid dented state budget for 2021-22 that provides for additional expenditure Rs. 1164 crore and tax concessions of Rs. 191 crores against additional revenue mobilisation of just rupees 200 crore, leaving a cumulative deficit of Rs. 1306-609 crore. Moderator further explain the current problems explained by farmers at Delhi and point out the raising prices of petrol. Both team express their views on the same with supporting data. Team A give emphasis on 'Making India 'project, physical and financial capital, innovation and R&D, MSME and industry, Health etc. Team B give emphasis on welfare pensions, Kerala development and innovation, strategic council (K – DISC) to utilise digital platform to provide jobs.

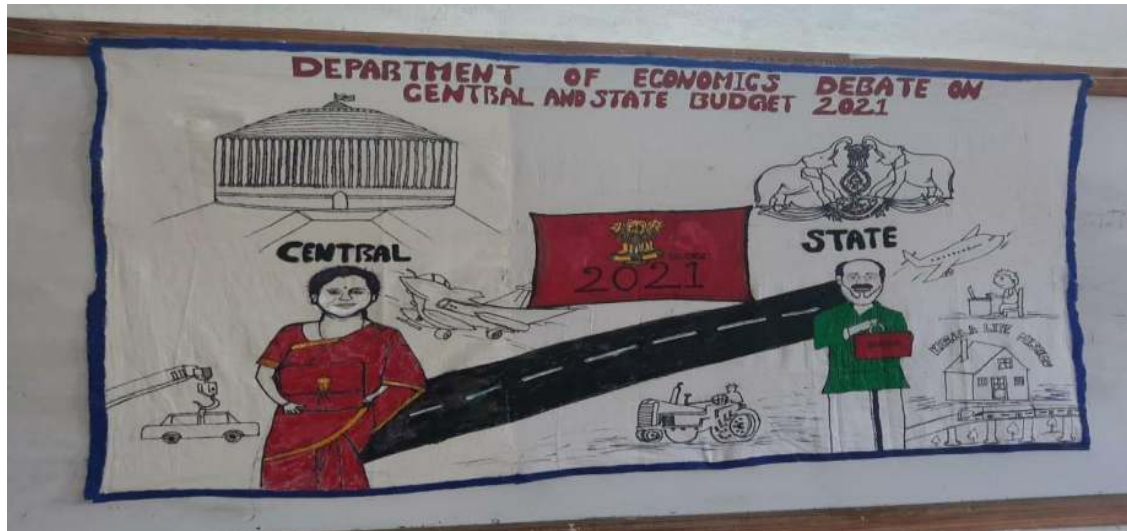

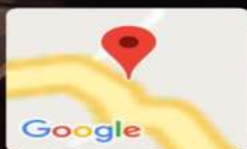

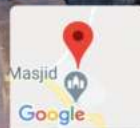

Women's Day Celebration,

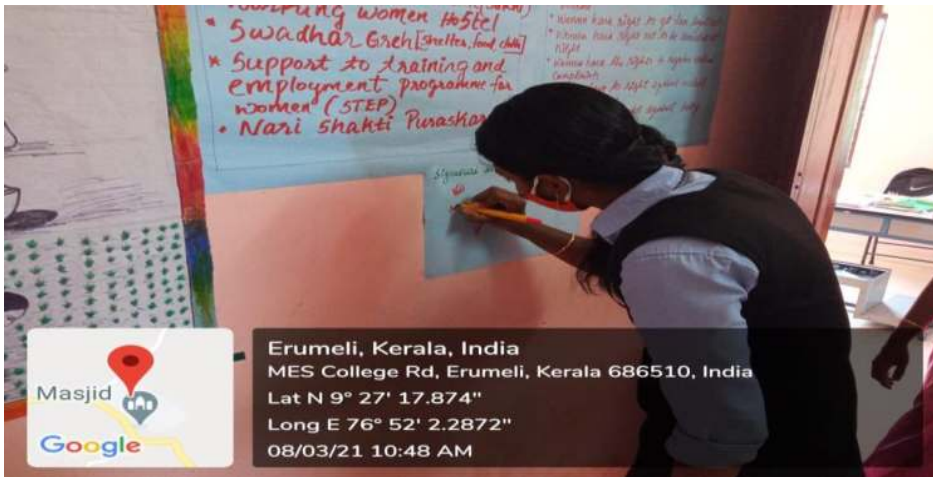
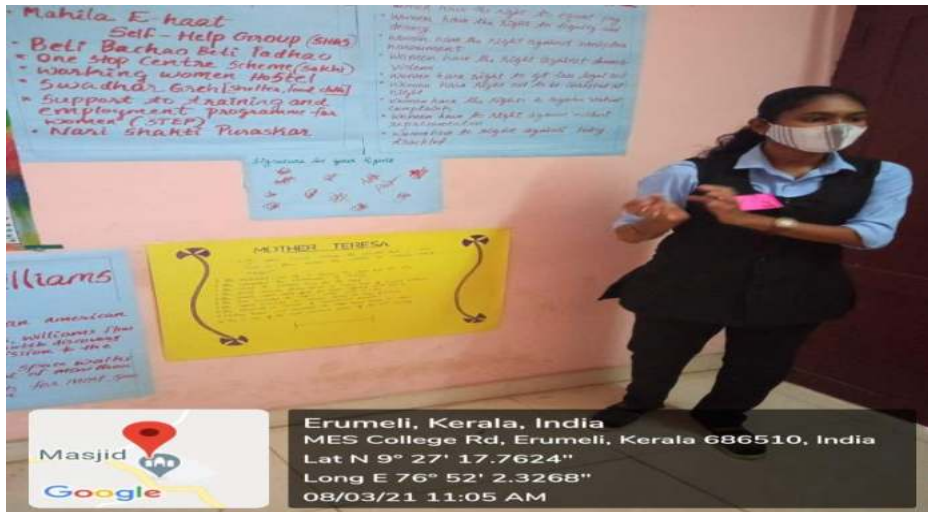
