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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

The M.E.S College, Erumely is one of the first unaided Arts and Science Colleges affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, established in 1995. The college obtained **minority status** with effect from **September 2012**. The institution is situated at Erumely in Kottayam district, Kerala. The location is near the pilgrim centre **Sabarimala** and has many distinctive features that make the institution excel in every aspect. The college has a pivotal role during the pilgrim season. Erumely where **Vavar Palli** (Ninar Masjid) and **Kochampalam** (Temple) stand side by side is famous for **Hindu Muslim unity**. All the pilgrims worship both in Temple and Masjid and thus it is a unique place of communal harmony. Being located in the boundary of Sabarimala Forest, the aesthetic sense of the geographical region is yet another feature. The serene atmosphere, sylvan surrounding and nourishing unpolluted air will provide quite a **conducive environment for learning**.

The college **belongs to a network** of educational institutions established and operated by **Muslim Educational Society (M. E.S)**. The primary motivation for the inception of MES was the **enhancement of then backward Muslim community** and especially of its **female population**. It is really inspiring that **now the presence of Muslim women is more than 70% in higher education**.

The founders of the college had an excellent vision of spreading the true wisdom all-around irrespective of caste, creed, language and religion. The institution makes all efforts to be compassionate to the **marginalised sections**.

The College offers **Ten UG and Eight PG Programmes**. The infrastructural facility of the college is **sufficient** to meet **academic and non academic requirements**. It needs special mention that this achievement is **without any government fund**. The institution has **sufficient** number of **computers** for students and staff. College provides **hostel facilities for boys and girls**. The **reduced bus fair** cater to the needs of student community nearing 1000.

The college has **Two NSS Units** and they bring laurels to the institution many times including the **best unit award**. In 2022 the government has sanctioned an **NCC unit of 80 cadets** and this year enrolled 23 SD and 07 SW cadets were enrolled.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

M.E.S College, Erumely, affiliated to the Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, Kerala follows **CBCS and PGCSS** system as per university guidelines and academic curricula of the University in a well-planned manner. Academic and Administrative sections are headed by the Principal. The college council is constituted for effective implementation of curriculum which includes Principal, Vice Principal, IQAC Coordinator, head of the Departments and two elected senior faculties. IQAC prepares an **academic calendar** in tune with the university calendar and head of the Departments Prepare academic plans in accordance with this. Faculties, assigned by the university, actively participate in various curricular activities such as **curriculum design, syllabus revision, question bank preparation and paper valuation**. For the productive execution of teaching learning process, faculties should maintain **Lesson plan and Work diary**. Teachers and students are encouraged to publish research papers and to participate in workshops and seminars for curriculum enrichment. **Bridge courses, Certificate courses and Add-on courses** are conducted for students. Academic flexibility is maintained by offering a **choice for open courses and electives for UG and specializations for PG programmes**. As per the syllabus, all the programmes have **Main project in the final semester and mini project for BBA in III semester and for BCA in V semester**. The **MSW programme has field work in each semester and internship in final semester**. An **Internal Examination Committee** is constituted and continuous internal evaluation conducted according to the internal evaluation policy of the institution. Apart from the syllabus, which includes courses like environmental awareness, human values, and professional ethics, the college takes **initiatives to inculcate social responsibility and human values** to motivate students to participate in various socially committed programmes. **The feedback is collected from the stakeholders and is analyzed** for a check on curriculum efficiency.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The **admission process** of the **UG and PG** programmes is done through **Centralized Allotment Process (CAP) of MG University**, so transparency is maintained. **Enrollment** of students is on the basis of merit and reservation policies of the Government. It ensures the representation of SC, ST, OBC, OEC and Minority communities of society. College has a good record of toppers in university level. Institution conducts orientation programmes for freshers and their parents. **FDP, Seminars and Webinars** are conducted for faculties. The institution assesses learning levels of newly admitted students by conducting **entry level tests**. **Orientation classes and bridge courses** are provided to help students in their selected courses. College follows a **Mentor -Mentee system** and helps the students to enrich holistic development. The mentor maintains a **Students' Register** as a record of details of the mentee. **Student-Full time teacher ratio of 18:1** provides sufficient care for students. The **internal evaluation** procedure is **transparent** and the **grievances are resolved** through a three-level grievance redressal mechanism.

SWAYAM/NPTEL, MOOC going parallel with regular courses help to develop self-confidence and skills. **Average percentage of full-time teachers** against sanctioned posts during the last five years is **100 %** . College initiates various programmes like intercollegiate fests, Soccer fest, seminars and club activities to promote experiential learning. Teachers use **Google Classroom, Moodle LMS and PPT** presentation for curriculum delivery and assessment process. The details of **PO, PSO and CO** are published in the website.

Research, Innovations and Extension

MES College Erumely fortifies research, innovation and extension activities through the **Research Forum and Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centres (IEDC)**. Research Forum organizes activities to promote the research culture in the institution. Various activities like **National and International Seminars, Webinars, Workshops, Paper Presentation Competitions etc.** have been conducted to promote the theoretical writing and analytical skills of faculties and students. To promote research activities, seed money is provided to faculties and students. We have 26 Faculty Publications and 18 student publications. Some departments have established linkages/ collaborations with leading institutions/ Organizations.

Entrepreneurship Development Club (ED club) of the institution was registered with Directorate of Industries & Commerce under Entrepreneurship Development Club Programme of Industries & Commerce, Government of Kerala. Moreover, the Institution registered for YIP . These clubs conducted various activities like Seminars and webinars on Start Ups, Innovation and IPR to promote the entrepreneurial skills of the students.

Relevant extension activities are carried out by **Departments, NSS, and various clubs, forums and cells like Red Ribbon Club, Women's Forum**. Institution got various awards and recognition for its extension activities. Our NSS unit was selected best in the university and state level in 2016-2017. Two main projects of our NSS Unit are

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The institution provides various academic and non- academic facilities for the overall enhancement of the students. To facilitate teaching - learning, the institution has spacious **classrooms, well equipped laboratories,**

ICT enabled seminar hall etc. MES College, which has witnessed various infrastructural milestones, is situated in a **15.4 - acre campus and has 35 well-lit, furnished classrooms and five laboratories including an Electronics Lab, 3 Computer labs and a Psychology lab.** An ICT enabled seminar hall of 2319 square feet, with 250 seats and an Open Auditorium of 5829.2 square feet to accommodate entire students. The college store has a **reprographic facility** and a cafeteria. A clean canteen is available for students and staff. College sports ground has 4 tracks of a 100 meter, a long jump and high jump pit. Also, the Volleyball and Badminton courts have prescribed dimensions. The college **library** is automated with a collection of **12000 books.** Campus is Wi-Fi enabled with **2 broadband connections of 100 Mbps speed, 24 hours surveillance facility with 52 CCTV cameras. Two generators with 63 KV and 25 KV capacities** for power back up, maintaining a transformer within campus. **4 college buses** provide transport facilities. A prayer hall in the campus fulfills spiritual needs of staff and students. Public addressing systems like the common announcement system, microphone, speaker, amplifier, and college website are available for effective communication. **ATM (South Indian Bank) and Post office (Propose Post Office)** facilities in the campus cater the needs of staff, students, and local populace as well.

Student Support and Progression

M.E.S College strives to reflect its Vision and Mission through a variety of Programmes carried out under Student Support and Progression. Being a **Self -financing institution** we **do not have** so many **scholarships** but **an average 30.6%** of the students get Government Scholarship and free ships from the institution. **10% Fee Concession** are given to all students due to Covid-19 in the year **2020-2021.** **Minority Centered Programmes** like **Pre Marital Councelling** for Minority students are conducted every year. More over, **Post matric scholarships** can also be availed. The College gives special focus on Coaching for Competitive Exams, Career Counseling, Soft Skill Development, Additional Skill Development Programmes etc. An Effective **Grievance and Redressal Cell, Anti Ragging Cell, Anti Sexual Harassment Cell, Internal Complaint cell, Women's Forum** etc. have been successfully pursuing in the college. A good number of the Outgoing students get placed or go to higher education every year. Some of our students were placed in prestigious institutions and some got selections in Competitive Exams like NET, KMAT, GMAT etc. **Slow learners** are identified and they are given **Remedial coaching and Bridge Courses** for promoting them. To develop **skillset** among students **Certificate Courses and Add-on courses** are also conducted . **College Union election** is conducted every year in the **Parliamentary mode** and the **Union leads** in organizing various **Cultural and Sports Events** in the Campus. The Institution has an active **Registered Alumni** which contributed liberally during the time of flood, Covid-19 etc. Alumni also contribute much to the development of the institution in the form of organizing lectures, arranging scholarships for students, donating books to students, arranging placements etc. The institution has **42 endowments** installed by stake holders and benefactors.

Governance, Leadership and Management

The college is **governed** by **Muslim Education society** with definite Vision, Mission and Core values. The College has a **well-organized administrative structure** led by the **Management committee of M.E.S College Erumely.** The college adopts **decentralisation and participatory management** and strives hard to realise its vision and mission. To attain the core values of the institution a **Strategic Plan** is prepared under the supervision of the Management. The management implements welfare measures like **EPF, ESI, and Maternity leave.**

For the effective implementation of teaching learning process, **Teaching plan and Teacher's diary** are maintained. Academic and non-academic activities are recorded in the Teacher's diary. Institution organizes various FDP's and Seminars to improve the knowledge and wisdom of entire community. During Covid-19 Pandemic, IQAC organized two 5 day FDPs namely **Managing ICT enabled online classes and Moodle - Learning Management Systems** to get acquainted with online teaching methods.

The **performance** of the Faculty is evaluated by students using **Teacher's Evaluation form**. The Institution's **Performance Appraisal System** for **teaching and non-teaching** staff helps to evaluate their performance and to **give suggestions for the improvement**. More over **feedback from the stakeholders** helps to ensure quality.

College is a local chapter of **Swayam / NPTEL**. The computer labs have been used as centres for **TCS and other online tests which generate revenue**. Resources of the college have been **utilised for noble purposes**. They include **College bus facility** made available for **Flood relief activity** and for **conveyance of healthcare team of Kottayam Medical College, in COVID relief activity**

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of MES College Erumely **started** functioning on **20/11/2018**. The aim is to develop a quality culture and innovation in learning processes to maintain the well-coordinated functions of academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.. IQAC strives to be fair to its objectives and functions. **In association with various stakeholders, IQAC tries to enhance the overall development of the students.**

Institution conducts **regular financial auditing**. Financial Auditing under the supervision of MES State Committee **enables the transparency and efficient management of accounts.**

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	<p>In tune with the vision of NEP, college strives to provide high quality education for students. The institution aims to create well educated, socially responsible, knowledgeable young adults and make them successful in life. Various academic programs offered by the college are in the disciplines of Management, Science, Social work, Arts and Literature. Students are encouraged to undertake projects in multidisciplinary areas. The Research forum of the college provides an academic platform for students and faculty members to present their views in multidisciplinary areas. In an intercollegiate fest Busqueda De Talento organized by college, all departments conduct competitions on</p>
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	interdisciplinary subjects. The college provides Certificate courses for academic and vocational needs of the students. The college opted for a variety of open courses for final year students. Academic flexibility exists and the students can choose any open course of their choice. Moreover MSW students are offered different specializations.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Implementation of ABC depends on the rules and regulations of the affiliating university. The institution is ready to be a part of ABC once it is implemented by the University. Even now the college acts as NPTEL local chapter since 2020 and around 1500 students registered for Swayam courses. Students are being informed about National Education Policy and Academic bank of Credits.
3. Skill development:	Skill development programmes identifies skill gap and provides skill training and employment benefits to students. These programs aim to acknowledge the ability of the students and extend the support by serving them with proper guidance, opportunities and encouragement. To meet the above demands, the institution has started 9 certificate courses in the academic year 2020-2021, 12 certificate courses in the year 2021-2022 and also 4 Add-on courses. A career and placement cell of the college conducts orientation programs and skill development training. To encourage the students' entrepreneurial abilities, a center for Kerala State Industrial Development Cooperation has been established in the college. The ED club of the institution also encourages students in achieving the same goal. The club is active in organizing different programmes for the students. The sports and cultural activities conducted by the institution help the students for developing their skills.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	The nation and the individual both benefit from the promotion of Indian arts and culture. The college has organised programmes to promote art, literature, and culture while also taking effective steps to incorporate the Indian knowledge system into the teaching and learning processes. The English Department provides courses including Indian Writing in English and Reading India. These courses aimed to introduce students to the key movements and authors of Indian literature in English in order to give them a better understanding of India's historical,

	<p>cultural, and literary history. Goal of these courses include issues with language, nation, and aesthetics. The college selects Hindi and Malayalam as second languages. Hindi curriculum aims to explore into the unique characteristics of Kashmir as the Pride of the Nation and Heaven on Earth. From that course the students will learn how to overcome challenges in their lives by embracing the writings of Dr. A P J Abdul Kalam, the former president of India. In addition, the curriculum has chapters that glorify the dignity of Indian culture. In Malayalam, students got an awareness about India's culture and tradition by studying the travelogues about Himalayas, the snow flaked mountains. The students also learned about the Dalit Reformation movement and the incidents that paved the way to this movement. In collaboration with National Service Scheme and other clubs, the college organises a variety of events under the direction of IQAC to promote tradition and culture. The College observes Teacher's Day, International Yoga day, International mother language day, International Family day etc., so that it may emphasize cultural consciousness among students. The campus radio broadcasts programmes related to culture and heritage of Kerala.</p>
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	<p>Outcome based education focuses on specific outcomes. It aims on the lifelong skill sets, students need to acquire. The affiliating university has implemented Outcome based education. All activities of the college are designed to help students in achieving the outcome. IQAC organized a Two-day workshop for faculties on Outcome Based Education in association with Kerala State Higher Education Council. IQAC organizes orientation programme for first year students at the beginning of the academic year. A general awareness about outcome based education is given at that time. The head of the departments and faculties in charge explain the PO, PSO and CO to the students during the sessions itself. Teaching plan is prepared by the faculties considering respective course outcomes. The outcomes are displayed at prominent places in each department for proper awareness. Social work students analyze a problem in community settings and prepare feasible solution by interacting with different stakeholders.</p>

College office and Amenities

- A well-furnished automated office with **DKATIA ERP** caters the requirements of students. Dedicated staff in various sections are available for all informational requirements of students. **Consumer Store, Reprographic facility, Canteen**, which can accommodate 70 students, Dedicated Parking space, **ATM, Post Office, Generator, Prayer Area, Hostel Facility and Transport facilities** are available for students.

- **The MOODLE platform is used as LMS.**
- PG Students can use the internet at their net lab hours.

The College has **automated office** operations with **DKATIA ERP Software**. The official communications to teachers are given through emails, notices and other electronic media.

There are different WhatsApp groups for teachers, parents and students so that the head of the institution, the teachers, and the students are in constant touch. The **student's attendance is also taken using an Attendance Management System** through dedicated application. Reports can also be taken through this system and SMS alerts are sent to parents, about the absence of students in the class in the first hour itself.

The meeting of the executive committee is held at least three times a year. Our Alumni have spread all over the parts of the World and the Association always keeps in touch with them. During the **flood of 2018 our Alumni contributed dress materials, medicines, provisions etc for the victims in Pathanamthitta and Kottayam districts**. In the times of Covid our NRI Alumni contributed significantly. In 2021 floods, again the Association gave enough support to victims.

Our Alumni Association initiates steps to recognize the outstanding achievements in curricular and cocurricular activities, sponsor scholarships for deserving students, establish **endowments, conduct soft skill training programmes**, language skill training programmes, and life skill programmes like Yoga Practice, supports college authorities for the development of the college and organises programmes of benefit to the students of the institution. Many of our prominent **Alumni visit our college as resource persons for Academic and Non Academic matters**. During the visit they spend some time with our present students and give motivational talks and disseminate information on respective career opportunities. Moreover they **sponsor cash prizes for various competitions** in the college. They also initiate job fairs and campus recruitment for our present students. The Alumni also find time to discuss the curricular aspects of our college. Many times their valuable suggestions and contributions helped us a lot in achieving our goal.

Another noteworthy feature of Alumni is that they always provide a support system for our staff who are in need of help. There are two cases which need special mention. One of the office staff had to discontinue the service due to health problems. A retired support staff had age related problems. In both cases Alumni made financial support and thus proved their commitment to the institution.

M.E.S. College, Erumely is an unaided Arts & Science college **established in** 1995 under the Muslim Educational Society. It is **affiliated to MG University**. College has a **clear-cut hierarchical structure with a Governing Body as apex forum for realising the vision and mission**. The college belongs to a network of educational institutions founded and operated by Muslim Educational Society.

The institution is governed by the College Management Committee consisting of **secretary, chairman, treasurer and other members**. It is the high level policy making apex forum of the institution. The **Management Committee of the college**, the appointing authority, takes decisions in the **administrative affairs which includes financial resource management, infrastructural development** etc. They ensure that the strategic plans and policy decisions of the college are well aligned with the stated mission of the institution. The **Governing Body** convenes regularly to **make decisions in tune with the timely needs of the institution**. Response:

MES College Erumely has a system to realise different means of financial resources, the efficient utilization and management of funds. It facilitates to widen the resource base for the attainment of our long-term and short-term goals adhering to the strategic plan. The following are the procedures for the efficient collection and utilization of funds. **The management prepares the annual budget in accordance with the needs of the institution and allocates funds for it. The Secretary / Chairman and the Treasurer of the Management Committee** of the institution deal with funds and ensure transparency in the process.

As a **self financing institution**, the tuition fee collected from the students is the main source of income. Rent collected from hostelites is another source of income. The computer labs have been used as centres for online tests which generate revenue. **Government funds received for the functioning of clubs like ED club, NSS, red ribbon club, Bhoomitra sena club are limited in amount and are mainly utilised for extension activities.**

Management allocates enough funds to meet the infrastructural development of the institution. Financial support is provided for seminars, faculty development programmes, workshops, orientation classes etc. The college effectively utilises the income for distributing **endowments to meritorious students, Provident fund (PF) and Employee State Insurance (ESI)** for teaching and non-teaching staff. Incomes are mainly utilised for Employee welfare measures, daily operating expenses and maintenance costs etc. In short, the entire Revenue has been used for the wider benefit of the students and staff community.

Transparency of accounts is maintained through **regular financial auditing**. The auditing procedure ensures systematic and efficient utilisation of available financial resources. The **Auditors** are **appointed by the MES State committee**.

Department of Social Work collaborated with the Department of Electronics, **distributing Solar Lamps** who didn't have Electricity power connection in **Vellarada Grama Panchayath in Thiruvananthapuram District**. It was an effective extension activity for the students as it had a sense of deep community engagement, planning and implementation of the identified needs.

As a part of **150 Years of celebrating Gandhi Jayanti**, the institution organized a **Mega Cleaning Programme**, a mission for Zero Plastic Zone at Erumely. The Context

Sabarimala is the ‘Sacred Abode of Lord Ayyappa’ and one of the most important Hindu pilgrim centres in the country. Situated in the foothills of Sabarimala, the College experiences the blessings of religious harmony. The practice highlights the important vision of MES College Erumely, enhances the traditional culture of Sabarimala pilgrim centre. There are a lot of stiff traditional practices, rituals, preparations and dress codes meant for those intending to visit Sabarimala. The keynote objective of the College is to enable an active life and participate in and exert influence over society and their everyday lives. Through THAPASAM the institution creates holistic development of the students and provides basic assistance and support to Sabarimala Pilgrimage.

The Practice

An ambitious digital initiative, “**THAPASAM** ” aims to streamline and facilitate the essentials to pilgrims at Sabarimala. The whole college contributing their part in this programme and experiencing different phases of social service. Major activities are

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

The Tribal Transformation Initiatives implemented by MES College Erumely ensures that our students have the **opportunity to comprehend tribal cultures, their environments, their communities, and the whole society.** The institutions accomplish the objectives that promote **inclusive environments, enrichment of marginalised people, and sustainable growth of tribal communities.** The goal is to uplift the community by providing high-quality education, to provide **opportunities** for lifelong learning that are **innovative, structured, and applicable,** to enrich lives and realise dreams by empowering students to pursue and succeed in their ideal careers, and **to shed light on the core values of equity, equality, skill development, and selflessness.** Having completed 27 years, the institution has established its ability to carry out its mission and to excel in higher education sectors of Central Kerala.

The institution is located in a rural setting accessible for most of our students who hail from the lesser Socio- Economic backgrounds. Majority of the students belong to **the minority and marginalized communities.** The college ensures the upliftment of all the students, especially those who belong to the backward communities. The college stands for equality and equity, wishing to create more inclusive social activities that enrich the **Tribal and rural communities.**

The primary goal of rural development programmes is to increase the standard of living in the chosen community on an economic and social level. **Tribal Transformation Initiatives** imply greater social transformation both inside and outside of the community as well as **improved human economic conditions.** Through a variety of initiatives, we work to promote togetherness among the community and foster an inclusive environment. The institution promotes literacy programmes to uplift the tribal, marginalized and rural communities. It helps them to be technologically advanced people and encourages them to acquire some social skills.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is another initiative by the central government of India, hosting various activities, in MES College Erumely. Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge by the institutions to help build the architecture of Inclusive India. The Mission of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is to enable higher educational institutions to work with the people of rural India in identifying development challenges that they come across throughout their lives and implementing appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable and possible growth. This program is intended to create a framework of sustainable development in rural areas through active social involvement and interventions. MES College Erumely is actively taking part in Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. The

institution adopted five villages as part of UBA project, namely Erumely, Chirakadavu, Vellavoor, Manimala and Mundakayam of Kottayam District.

The NSS unit of MES College Erumely in association with CARD - a social service society, hosted Gotharaksha, an NSS Tribal Development Programme. The college organized a three days camp at Wayanad for implementing participatory tribal development programmes. The interventions included participatory rural appraisal in tribal settlement areas and organization of need-based action programmes. The unit organized a Social Debate and Rural Legal Literacy at the adopted village regarding the effectiveness of the decentralized planning process.

Edakadathi is a small **village** in Pathanamthitta district. **The college adopted this village** and conducted various socio-economic developmental programmes in Edakadathy. It includes Anti-Drug day, an awareness programme against the use of potential substances, and also conducted programmes based on sustainable development, about the harmful effect of plastic and how to manage plastic from household levels, how to reduce the use of chemical fertilisers and increase the use of natural fertilisers for agriculture. The NSS unit also conducted a census programme of Edakadathi and an opportunity to honour a farmer in Edakadathy for his selfless dedication towards eco-friendly farming techniques in the village. NSS volunteers from the college had visited almost every house in the village in order to make them aware about the reuse of plastics and to make an organic compost by using the food wastes and other biodegradable wastes to make manures.

Outreach Program of rural areas help students undergo experiential learning with social commitment through field action and Extension Activities experiencing rural realities. Also, the Social Work Department conducted various tribal enrichment programs. . The department conducted this in order to improve people's perception about tribes, their existence in the society, how their traditional ways help conserve the idea of sustainability and decorum in the environment and also preserve the last remains of historical value they have in Kerala. This program was initiated after the department visited tribal villages in the locality as well as famous villages in other districts such as Wayanad. They visited the villages to honour the head, as well as understand their ways and the systems that prevail among the people that live within the four walls of the village. The visit also shed light on how globalization and modernisation kill tradition, history and environmental conservation, which were duly addressed at the awareness programs conducted. The program also included ways in which a common person can contribute to help preserve and keep the tribal villages from flourishing in their environment; which is a grassroot level of awareness.

As part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsavam, the Business Administration department of MES College Erumely and the Tribal Development department jointly organized the celebrations in Attathodu, a tribal village near Pampa. Ooru presented various art forms to introduce their culture to the students. Students performed street plays and flash mobs. It enhances the students ability to work with the people of tribal areas in identifying challenges that they come across throughout their lives and implementing appropriate solutions for accelerating sustainable and possible growth. The college strives to bring out truth and spread knowledge to the society, for the future of the society and has seen to record successful awareness programmes and other related programs in nearby villages as well as in other districts. This is the evidence of how MES College Erumely, lives up to its mission and vision.
