FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES

Relief work and community organizations

Community organizations and movements in Kerala are very strong. It is clearly seen from the role played by religious and community organizations in flood relief. They were at the forefront of helping all sections of the people irrespective of caste or creed. From time to time, they have delivered food and clothing to relief camps, and the economically strong class of the respective communities have come forward for the same. The efforts taken by all Christian, Muslim and Hindu religious leaders during the flood relief is unprecedented. Each of the organizations, individuals and communities contributed crores of rupees directly to the Chief Minister's Disaster Relief Fund. In this regard, MES and its institutions have unequivocally exercised its historic mandate.

MES and Relief Operations

The founder of the MES Movement, Dr. Fazal Ghafoor Sahib spearheaded the relief operations. His convictions were very clear in the flood relief operations.

Dr. Fazal Ghafoor says, "The temple that was opened for prayers, the Christian churches and the Muslims who cleaned the temples probably would happen only in Kerala and also that such a rare sight could be attributed to the unbroken closeness between the communities." The MES State Committee has decided to carry out relief work worth about Rs 2 crores and has come forward to implement it. Moreover, MES institutions have canceled all celebrations regarding Onam and Bakrid and raised the money for flood relief operations. The State Committee has decided to carry out relief work in Malappuram, Palakkad, Kozhikode, Wayanad, Alappuzha and Idukki districts. Medical care was also made available under the courtesy of MES Medical College.

As part of the relief efforts, 1000 volunteers under the leadership of Dr. Fazal Gafoor, assembled at the Alappuzha Collectorate and the clean-up operation was carried out with the help of MES college NSS and NCC volunteers. Essentials and medicines were distributed. As part of MES Mega Cleaning, MES state committee members, Dr.Fazal Gafoor and secretary P.O Labba had reached the Alappuzha Collectorate on 30th August. State Public Works Minister, G Sudhakaran inaugurated the program. Sanitation operation was flagged off by Dr.Fazal Ghafoor.

Students and staff members of MES College participated in the clean-up operation until 6pm and volunteers cleaned about 30 educational institutions and several houses in Kuttanad and Alappuzha town. The second phase was carried out in the flood affected areas of Ernakulam district. Students and staff members of various higher education institutions such as Marampally MES College, Asmabi College Kodungallur, MES College Nedumkandam and MES College Erumely lead the clean-up operation. In addition, under the leadership of MES Youth Wing, study materials were distributed to students in flood affected areas in Idukki district. Voluntary organizations, individuals and communities have been mobilized for flood relief from foreign countries. As a result, a good amount of money was raised and relief work was carried out.

MES College of Koothuparambu and other MES institutes have stepped in for flood relief in Wayanad. Under the auspices of MES Ernad, Nilambur Taluk Committee, essential items were

distributed free of cost to about 750 families. All the MES Institutions in Kerala and the Gulf countries have spearheaded the relief efforts and have caught the attention of the people of the State. Beyond being an educational agency, you can see the excellence of the charitable work of an organization with a social commitment. It is gratifying that the activities carried out under the leadership of MES during the flood in Alappuzha on August 30 last year was able to ensure public participation in relief work rather than aid in cash or in kind.

FLOOD RELIEF OPERATIONS CARRIED OUT BY MES COLLEGE ERUMELY, FIRST PHASE

It was on 14th August Kerala State experienced a terrible flood. The people of Kerala encountered this natural calamity irrespective of caste or creed. The majority of people at the forefront of flood relief were young people. Mainly colleges, NGOs, government agencies and workers have all been involved in relief works. On this occasion MES college Erumely set an example to the state through historic and humanitarian charitable activities. The great commitment of MES College was appreciated by the Government of Kerala and the local self government institutions. As a part of flood relief activities, students and staffs of MES college, Erumely visited flood zones. It is an example of excellence of flood relief activities. Under the leadership of respected principal Maheen M. N, Coordinator Jitheesh K. S, College NSS program officers Santhosh K. K and Regula O. M, the teachers and students donated essential items to flood affected areas such as Ranny, Erumely panchayat, Perunad, Naranamthodu, Vechuchira panchayat, Athikayam and Angel valley. The third phase of operations was completed within the first week of the flood. The third phase of operations was completed within the first week of the floods. They reached the partially damaged houses and carried out cleaning works and took steps with the help of the panchayat to bring the market back to the functioning level. These areas were filled with mud and silt that reached from the Pampa river. These areas were restored by the students through hard work. The exemplary policy and compassionate work done by the Volunteers and college students was really appreciable. Students of MES college visited rehabilitation camps in Kisumam, Ranny, and Athikkayam. The cleaning activities in flood affected areas was a challenge. Because there are many factors that can lead to infections and deadly diseases that can affect those who are involved in cleaning activities. But the humanity shown by our college students in taking the necessary precautions and courageously stepping in and helping the needy is invaluable.

Phase II activities

The efforts made by MES College Erumely strengthened the second phase of relief activities carried out on the banks of Pampa and Kuttanad. Mega Cleaning 2018 was led by the MES Central Committee. Cleaning was the biggest challenge after the floods. Students of MES college and district officials organized a Mega Cleaning in Alappuzha on 30th August 2018. Dr. Fazal Gafoor flagged off the Mega cleaning effort. Almost thirty educational institutions in Alappuzha were cleaned through the efforts. MES college management chairman Syed Mohammad IRS, MES College principal Mahin MN, Coordinator Jitesh KS, Santosh KK, Sajan Antony, Jayce John, Sumayya P.A., teachers such as Mrs. Kavitha PD, Anna Joseph, Jisha Mary, Pretty Thomas, non-teaching staff members and about 50 students participated in the clean-up operation. Through the second phase activities, Alappuzha Govt. Town Girls Higher Secondary was cleaned and resumed normal working conditions.

The review meeting was held in the evening in the presence of Dr. Fazal Ghafoor and General Secretary P.O. J.Labba. Camp participants proudly shared their experiences. The Mega cleaning was able to share a great relief to Kuttanad. It is a matter of pride that MES College Erumely has been able to carry out relief works outside Pathanamthitta district.

Phase III activities

A meeting was organized in the college seminar hall on September 22 in order to evaluate the relief work done in connection with the floods and to honor the active members of the clean-up activities. The meeting was chaired by principal Maheen MN. MES self financing college chairman PH Najeeb, MES college Erumely chairman Syed Muhammed IRS and Coordinator Jitesh KS shared their words. This was followed by the inauguration of the distribution of student-made disinfectants, lotions, dishwashers and bleaching powders in flood-affected areas. About 100 students of this college participated in the making of these products. In addition to this rice, clothes, textiles and learning materials collected from houses were also distributed. Different teams were deployed to distribute cleaning products and essential items in Chengannur, Thiruvanvandoor and Alappuzha town areas. Nine teachers, about 100 students and college bus drivers participated in the distribution.

Survey conducted by the Department of Social Work

Paliam, India and MES college conducted a Damage Estimation Survey on September 3 and 4. The survey was conducted mainly in the Ranni area. The students turned into different groups and completed the survey. The survey was guided by Rajan Kurian, HOD MSW department and teachers Sajan Antony and Sultan Sulaiman.

Phase IV activities

Phase IV activities are mainly aimed at sustainable development. Reshma, a student of the BCA department lost her house completely in the flood. MES Management and NSS unit together is taking efforts to build a new house for Reshma. Resources are being mobilized for this. In addition, the NSS Volunteers worked hard to complete some of the work. Soon Reshma will own a house to live in. The decision to share the grief of their classmates and to build a home for them will serve as a model for all. Principal Maheen M.N., N.S.S. Program Officer Santosh K.K and Regula O.M are leading these services.

Students, teachers and non-teaching staff who participated in the relief work were felicitated at Erumeli MES on the inaugural day of the last college union. College Manager Mohammad Syed I.R.S honored them. Alshad, the student representative who led the students through his hard work, was specially honored at the ceremony.

MES MANAGEMENT AND EMIGRANT COMMUNITY

Erumely MES management, Principal, staff members, students, Kottayam district executives, members of emigrant communities and business men offered intelligible alliance for flood relief activities. Under the guidance of MES self financing management chairman P.H.Najeeb and Sunil Thananjackal members of emigrant communities distributed kits of necessary items worth 1.5

lakhs in Kisunam and Athikkayam areas. MES Kottayam District Committee gave helping hand to distress relief activities. MES management has offered helping hands to build a new house for a student of the BCA department, who lost her house in the flood. Lions club Ponkunnam gave a helping hand by sponsoring disinfectants.

N.S.S. Unit and relief operations

MES College Erumely, N.S.S. Unit undertook the historic mission of providing relief to those who are affected by the natural calamity and moved forward. NSS Volunteers led by Program Officers Santosh KK and Regula OM provided invaluable services in distressed areas. Edakadathy, Kisumam and Attikayam areas were the worst affected by the floods. Under the guidance of college principal Maheen MN, NSS volunteers have cleaned houses and public places here and made the houses habitable.

MES College N.S.S. unit has adopted Edakadathy village. Ermely Panchayat President TS Krishnakumar made the announcement. Vice Principal George John, N.S.S. Program Officers Santosh KK and Regula OM shared their words. N.S.S. volunteers also worked in Alappuzha, Ranni and Chengannur.


The N.S.S unit has organized a seven day camp in Edakadathy village from December 21 to 27, 2018. About 35 students participated in various action plans and awareness classes. Intermittent projects such as spring conservation, organic farming, zero waste management, anti-plastic campus, clearing the ground and planting plants and trees are conducted as part of the village beautification. A student of the BCA department lost her house in the flood. The NSS also provided the manpower required to build a new house for the student. The NSS was also involved in the clean-up operation in Ermely town. The unit actively participates in projects like Punyam Poonkavanam and Thanal is a perfect example of work ethic. The NSS Unit of MES College, Ermely has been awarded as the best unit in the university and the state by M.G University in recent years. The unit Provides invaluable service in post-flood relief operations.

In the first phase Edakadathy, Ranny and Athikkayam areas were cleaned and Alappuzha Model Girls' School was cleaned and made suitable for study in the second phase. In the third phase, disinfectants and study materials were distributed in Chengannur and Alappuzha areas. In addition, NSS Unit programme officer Santhosh K K and students handed over the notebooks and clothes collected from students to Kottayam Collector B.S.Thirumeni. The NSS unit strives to spread the concept of Green Kerala Clean Kerala to everyone.



DEPARTMENT WISE ACTIVITIES



Kerala flood 2019 was adversely affected by many communities across the state. The Department of Social Work decided to engage with one among them, which is in Elappara of Idukki District. On 17 th August 2019, 30 students and faculties of Msw department visited the flood affected areas and relief camp at Elappara .The aim of the visit was to get an understanding about the impact of flood and to enhance their psycho social well being ensuring mental support and providing some support in terms of materials for their socio economic security. On 7th August 2019, Idukki district was lashed by heavy rains leading to the flooding of low-lying areas and landslides in the high ranges. Many parts witnessed minor landslides and some areas were cut off from the rest of the district.Quarrying, razing hills for constructions, massive scale road constructions, and expansions in the mountains and mono-crop cultivations were debated those days as contributing factors in the landslides and also by the incessant rains of high magnitude induced by climate change. But at the end the representatives could see how this disaster became a social vulnerability for those who were in the community. Elappara was one of the most affected regions in the district. The social demography of the area was more of workers in the plantation

and their families. They live in Layam(small settlements) in the plantation with inadequate facilities.

Due to severe landslides almost all the Layam of the affected areas were at risk of further sliding and all of them were partially or entirely affected by the disaster. Among the affected households 60 % had totally collapsed and 40 % were partially damaged. The students along with the faculties had a mini plan of intervention for their social support and the journey planned from MES College Erumely. Representatives visited the Peermade Grama Panchayat office and handed over twenty five kits to the flood relief authority as a helping hand for the survivors.

The kits contain nutritious food items that do not need refrigeration and are easy to prepare. It also had Sanitary Napkins, Diapers, Emergency First Aid After handing over the kits the students visited Elappara flood relief camp Students reached there at 1.00 PM. The landslide survivors were residing in the parish Hall of church of God, Elappara. The relief camp was accommodated with twelve families. Of which the residents of 5 families completely collapsed and others were in partially destroyed states which cannot withstand further hit.

The facilities provided in camp were much limited for 12 families to survive. They were lacking basic amenities. The survivors of the disaster were in a traumatic situation. Most of the survivors lacked hope and felt helplessness. Students build rapport with them. The affected community members shared their circumstances and worries with the students. The students enlightened the hopeless by providing instructions about the support the government provides for the affected of landslides for upliftment. The landslide created both social and economic impacts. Most of the families there were joined and have more than 6 members. The layams were at risk of sliding and can't suffer a further hit. For resettlement they need to rebuild the layams Or need to settle on another which may not have basic facilities for a joint family to reside. Families were economically weak to rebuild the layams. Many of them were suffering from chronic diseases and not getting essential medical supplies at camp .The students interacted with them for sometime . Landslide affected regions were visited by the students and prepared detailed notes on the same.. Cultivating areas,houses, roads totally collapsed in the regions. The inhabitants were feared to suffer from further hit.





DEPT. OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION REPORT ON KERALA FLOOD RELIEF EFFORTS

Kerala has witnessed one of the worst-ever floods in a century. The unprecedented rains that started on 15 August 2018 triggered floods and landslides causing widespread destruction to lives and property, displacing tens of thousands of people and forcing more than a million people into relief camps. The team members of MES College Erumely held a supply distribution to support families in flood-affected areas by providing provisional items, medical supplies, clothes and household items. On 9th September 2018, the ED club and Department of Business Administration distributed 1000 bottles of dishwashing liquid and Cleaning lotion in flood-affected areas of Kottayam and Pathanamthitta Districts mainly in Ranni, Attikayam, and Kuttanad. It is prepared by ED Club members and BBA Students of MES College Erumely. For this purpose, our students collected empty plastic bottles from the students and from nearby places of our college. Then sorted the bottles into one liter and half liter and one liter bottles used for filling cleaning lotions and half liter bottles for Dishwash liquid. Around one week is taken to fill the bottles. The cost of raw materials was sponsored by Lions Club Ponkunnam.


Pic:1 Filled Bottles are ready for Distribution

FLOOD RELIEF ACTIVITIES OF NSS


The cleaning activities after the flood were started from 16th August 2018 under the guidance of Mr. Maheen M.N principal MES College Erumely. More than 100 students including NSS volunteers, programme officers and teachers participate in this activity. The cleaning work was made mainly in the areas of Athikkayam, Ranni, Edakadathy, Angel Valley and Kisumum in Pathanamthitta and kottayam districts. On 31st August 2018. Another work of cleaning activities under MES Kerala at Govt. Model Girls school Alappuzha, Mr. Fazhal Ghafoor (President MES Kerala), Prof. P.O.J Lebba (General secretary MES), Jb. V.S Syed Muammed IRS (Chairman MES College Erumely), Mr. P.H Najeeb (Chairman MES Self Financing College), Mr. Maheen M.N (Principal MES College Erumely) was also present.

A 'kit' including necessary household items were distributed to 23 floods affected families at kisummum and INRI groups at Kanjirappally. Another kit including necessary food items and other material were also distributed to the various floods affected families in this areas under the leadership of Mr. Jithesh K.S (Relief coordinator MES College Erumely).

MES College Erumely NSS unit conducted various flood related activities and cleaning programmes in the flood affected areas of Pathanamthitta, Kottayam and Alappuzha District from 15 th August 2018 to till the date. We the students and staff members cleaned and removed mud from the houses, shops and villages in the areas of Edakadathy, Vechoochira, Athikkayam, Kisummum, Angel Valley, Thulappally, Arenmula, Ranni and Kuttanad with the help of 50 volunteers and around 85 new volunteers from first years.

Our college students and staff collected one lakh seventy five thousand rupees to people those who are suffering from flood affected areas of the above mentioned places. And also distributed a special kit to the people of Thonikadavu and kisumum , with the help of Pravasi group kanjirappally with the leadership Adv. Sunil Thenamakal , Mr. Maheen M.N (Principal MES College Erumely) ,Santhosh K.K , Rajoota O.M (NSS Programme Officer) , Jithesh K.S (Co-Ordinator Relief Camp MES College Erumely), Our

Flood Relief Activities of NSS Unit

Flood relief activities were conducted in various places of flood affected areas of Pathanamthitta,Kottayam,Alappuzha District from 15th August 2018 to February 2019.The NSS Unit members cleaned and remove mud from the houses,shops & town in the area of Perunad, Ranni, Athikkayam, Vechoochira, Edakadathy, Kisumam, Angelvalley, Thulappally, Aranmula & Kuttanad. The NSS unit collected food items, cloths & medicines from various places and distributed them to flood affected areas with the help of respective local leaders.A kit including necessary household items were distributed to 23 flood affected families at Kisumam and 15 families at Thonikkadavu. The kit was sponsored by NRI group at Kanjirappally on 31st august 2018.Another work of cleaning activities under the NSS unit at Govt. Model Girls School, Alappuzha, Mr. Fazal Gafoor, President, MES Kerala, P.O.J Lebba, General Secretary, MES Kerala, Jb. Sayyed Muhammed IRS, Chairman, MES College Erumely, P.H Najeeb, Chairman, Self-Financing College and Mr. Maheen M.N, Principal, MES College Erumely were also participating.

The third stage of flood relief activities are the distribution of cleaning materials like lotion ,dishwash and bleaching powder produced by ED club of MES College Erumely in flood affected areas on 26th October 2018 at Aranmula ,on 26th at Kuttanad ,27th at Chengannur ,28th Ranni and Athikkayam.





